

EDITORIAL

One of the main things that has kept me busy for the last six weeks, apart from work at Siemens, are the changes to the Racing Rules. There are about 4 changes that effect on the water competition but the main changes are in the renumbering of some of the rules, so if you are a Sailing Secretary or have anything to do with Sailing Instructions do a careful trawl of the changes. Would you believe there are about 40 changes.

The 'On the water' changes are as follows:

Rule 52.2 (a) After touching a mark, you may exonerate yourself by doing 3600 turn.

Rule 53.1 A dinghy can now be ashore at her preparatory signal.

Rule 54.3 (a) It does not say that you can only roll your dinghy in one direction when 'Roll tacking' now. So presumably you can go over as far as you like, from one side to the other during a tack, that is as long as you do not make the boat go faster!!

Rule 64.2 A spinnaker can be set without a spinnaker pole and presumably a spinnaker pole can be set to leeward because the rule that said you couldn't has been deleted.

Appendix RYA 1 Scoring Systems - DNF DNC etc, these have all changed and spot the mistake in rule 6.4 of the same appendix, what should the cross reference be.

Finally the Tables at the back might be quite useful.

2. National Championships (22-27 August)

Arrangements are well in hand for the 1993 National Championships at Starcross Y.C. This is of course a new venue for our principal event in the Seafly calendar. Starcross has the largest Seafly Fleet and is planning a 'never to be forgotten' Seafly Week both on and off the water. The club is situated at Powderham Point, in the grounds of the Castle of the same name, about half a mile north of Starcross village on the Exe Estuary, a delightful setting in glorious Devon countryside. There is ample boat and car parking (both free) and well-equipped clubhouse with new showers and a galley "manned" by Jean Brooks and her team. The Principal Race Officer will be Andy Woolner and social arrangements are in the capable hands of Charlie Sandys. The bar has an all-day licence and it is hoped to arrange for a child minder during racing.

There will be the usual one race per day, with a Practice Race on Sunday and five Championship Races with four to count for overall points. The start on Sunday will be at 10:00 and on Friday 14:30. Because of tidal conditions a Long Distance race is not practicable, although an afternoon cruise down the estuary is planned. Olympic courses will be sailed when possible, with committee boat starts. Two rescue boats will be afloat, one new this year. Good prizes are promised.

3. NATIONAL DINGHY SHOW - SAILBOAT '93

As predicted in the last Newsletter we were unable to obtain an acceptable pitch at the Crystal Palace. Yachts & Yachting published my letter in their Dinghy Show issue protesting at our exclusion and pointing out in particular the unfairness of allowing some classes to have a double space when others are excluded. I am heartened to read in the Late March issue of the same magazine the letter from the Class

Captain of the YW 14ft Dayboats at Gravesend SC making the same point. I have also written to our representative on the RYA Class Associations Committee asking him to raise the matter at their March meeting. So I hope that the RYA Committee which organises the Dinghy Show will listen and take note of the protests and that we will be back at Sailboat'94.

4. EXOTIC MATERIALS

A member who is fitting out a boat has discovered a source - Australian I believe - of fittings which contain carbon fibre, yet cost less than similar fittings from other firms. He has raised the question of whether these can be legal in view of the Prohibition Rule 23.3 in our Rules of Measurement & Construction, which specifically bans materials containing carbon fibre. The answer I'm afraid has to be that they are not permissible as the Rule stands.

However, this Rule was inserted when our own rules were revised in 1987 and was based on practice in several other classes. Personally I think it was intended to ban carbon fibre in hulls, spars, foils, sails, etc; in those days it was probably not used in fittings. There is a good case to be made for banning it in hulls, spars foils, sails and so on where those with long pockets can gain improved performance. But if fittings are actually cheaper should they be banned? The Committee will be considering this question and whether an amendment to Rule 23.3 should be submitted to the next AGM.

OPEN MEETING REPORTS

DRAYCOTE WATER - Silver Salver Pursuit Race 1993

This time it was not 'blown off' or cancelled due to lack of wind, in fact it was quite a nice day with a gentle force 2-3 and the forecast saying it would increase to 4 by the afternoon.

Unfortunately only Mike and Simon Robinson in Seafly 470 could attend as Ivan Phillips wasn't well enough to go.

Apart from the sailing it is very interesting event where one can 'rub shoulders' with some of the top helms you read about in Y & Y and look at the very latest developments in the classes. And the occasional new class, such as the ISO and 405. They came from as far afield as Arun in Scotland and boats varied from Mirrors to Tempests

As usual we started with a number of Lasers and at the first mark we had 2 Lasers in front and 3 behind, mind you one of the Lasers must have been in a particular choppy piece of the lake as his mast kept rolling from one side to the other. I managed to get within hailing distance and asked him if he knew about IYR Rule 54. Funny, the lake must have suddenly gone less choppy.

The first half of the race saw us gradually catch one or two boats but, in the light winds a Moth sailed by Roger Angel came creeping up and past. The force 4 winds never materialised, so it was going to be a day for the none trapeze boats. We could see two GP14's ahead which didn't seem to be getting any nearer and sure enough one of them eventually came third.

We had a 'coming together' with a Scorpion who sailed over us and his spinnaker touched our mainsail and shroud. I shouted "Windward boat keep clear" he shouted back "Mast abeam" and that was after he had touched us and got clear ahead. I asked him to do a "720" he said no, I was at fault. I put my red flag up and looked round for a witness, there was a boat down to leeward and I asked him if he would be a witness for me and to my surprise they said I was in the wrong, then I noticed it was another Scorpion, end of story.

In the end we came 67 out of 107 who started. The Moth winning by about 30 seconds from a Streaker and a GP14 third.

As well as being ideal for conventional use (i.e. with mast stepped, and the main halyard attached to a centre lifting position), these covers are ideal when towing because they do not 'blow up' and obstruct the rear view while driving. When the boat is parked without the mast up, they are better than a 'boom up cover', as the cover does not sag in the middle and allow water to collect, a couple of slats of wood across the middle and the boat stays completely dry.
