

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS, Seasalter S.C. 21-26 August

These will soon be upon us! Have you sent in your application yet? The form was enclosed with the Spring Newsletter.

Seasalter is an ideal place to make an entry to championship racing. Launching is very easy from the gently sloping sandy beach and the races are held in the sheltered waters of the Swale estuary - no big waves or swells.

There is an excellent clubhouse with all the usual back-up facilities and the club owns its own adjacent camping site. There is also plenty of caravan and other accommodation nearby. So why not have a go this year? Don't be afraid that everyone is a hot-shot. There will be sailors of all abilities and one can have great fun competing at the back of the fleet without all the pressures which the experts bring upon themselves.

The entry fee £60, down on last year, and the club has asked for a guarantee of at least 20 boats so we need a good turnout to avoid a heavy drain on the Association's funds.

4. NATIONAL DINGHY SHOW -SAILBOAT '95

After much criticism by many classes participating in the annual Dinghy Show over the many shortcomings of the Crystal Palace Sports Centre. The RYA has announced that next year Sailboat will be held at Alexandra Palace in North London on 4th-5th March.

The whole exhibition will be housed under one massive glass roof and ample room is promised for all the classes who wish to participate, with easy drive-in access. Admission prices are to be the same as this year, parking for visitors will be free and only a small increase in basic stand prices is anticipated.

Alexandra Palace is just inside the North Circular Road at Wood Green, North London, only 20 minutes from the M1/M25 junction and within easy reach of Piccadilly Line and B.R. trains.

So the prospect is for a very much better and bigger Dinghy Show. Whether it will be good for the Seafly Class is a difficult question. The new venue may not suit many of our southern members, although it is much nearer to the M25 than the Crystal Palace. On the other hand it will be much better for anyone living north of London which should attract many more visitors and hopefully we shall receive interest from members of clubs in the Midlands.

Speaking personally, the new venue will be inconvenient as the Crystal Palace gave me the opportunity to stay with relatives nearby. I have now run the Seafly stand for 11 years and the transfer to Alexandra Palace seems to me to be a suitable time to hand over to someone else who can re-think and perhaps improve our presentation of the Seafly. It is not a very great commitment but it is the one big opportunity we have to promote the Seafly and it is vital to maintain our presence at the Show. If any member would consider taking on the job please let me or a member of the committee know.

Hull Preparation, or How's Your Bottom

Had a look at your bottom recently, or should I say the hull of your Seafly It is very much the neglected area of the boat yet in perfect condition can give you an edge of the opposition. These tips can apply to GRP and wood

It is not to late to get that extra speed from your boat, especially if you haven't had a look at the underside of your boat since the start of the season.

First, tip your boat on its side protect the gunwhale and topsides with 3"-4" thick foam or old settee cushions, make sure the boat will not come upright suddenly when you apply pressure to the hull etc.

By using a combination of sight and touch any indentations can be quickly spotted. If they are more than Imm deep then they should be filled using an epoxy resin base a light weight filler mixed in. Make sure the scratches etc are deaned first with fresh water, then with a cleaning agent such as "Isopropyl Alcohol" that is the stuff you clean tape recorder heads etc should be able to get some from Hi-Fi retailers, or polyurethane thinners.

Any loose paint must be carefully cut back, any cracks in the paint work, cut a V into the crack so that filler can be easily applied. The filler will shrink slightly after drying so a second application may be required it is surprising how far a small amount of filler will go so only mixit in small portions.

Sanddown with wet & dry starting with 250 grade and finishing with 400 grade.

I then like to finish the underside of the hull with 600 to 800 grade wet & dry . Leave the topsides shiny they shouldn't goin the water very much.


Some people go for a really shiny bottom using wax and car polishes to create a mirror like finish but have you ever tried dropping a small amount of water on a waxed surface, it goes into large blobs, know try the same amount of water onto a surface that has been rubbed down with 600 wet & dry, the water flows away, spreads over a larger surface area, Less 'Surface tension'


By having less surface tension you get laminar flow across the surface of the hull rather than a turbulent flow were small vortices from at or near the hull surface and water moves rapidly backwards and forwards between the hull and the stationary surrounding layers. With laminar flow the water actually sticks to the surface of the hull, so that the water nearest the hull is going nearly the same speed as the hull and as you progressively move away the water becomes more stationary (with respect to the hull) With a waxed shiny bottom the water doesn't stick, in fact it is repelled from the surface so that the water is going passed the hull as fast as the forward speed of the boat and drag increases Energy to drive the vortices must come from somewhere and this is energy lost from that available to drive the boat.

Of course the same applies to the rudder and centreboard, so check them NOW not at the champs when little can be done.




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
